Scientific Research in Armenia – Armenia's Young Scientists by Professor Ashot Chilingarian

Since the collapse of the Soviet Union, Armenia's scientific community has had to struggle for funding and to educate bright young scientists. Yet Armenia's scientists still have rather high numbers of important research papers published in scientific journals. Some of Armenia's research institutions have impressed the international

community with their accomplishments. However, with most of Armenian scientists getting older, the situation is declining very fast.

Professor Ashot Chilingarian, Director of the Armenia's A. Alikhanian National Laboratory (Yerevan Physics Institute), is the leading scientific institution in Armenia. He has authored 350 scientific publications in the field of astrophysics and the new scientific topic of high-energy physics in atmosphere. He, with his senior scientists, continues to educate a new generation of bright young Armenian men and women who have impressed the international scientific community. A goal is to provide future career paths for young talented scientists.

Prof. Chilingarian is a member of major scientific organizations and represents Armenia in a number of international scientific forums.
